The Conservative Plan for Change will mean you can afford food and housing in safe communities. The Plan for Change:

- 1. Cuts the Liberal deficit by 70% with less spending on bureaucracy, consultants, foreign aid, and handouts to insiders and special interests, while boosting growth with resource jobs.
- 2. Lowers income tax 15%, saving the average worker \$900 and average working family \$1,800.
- 3. Builds 2.3 million homes by axing home sales taxes and paying cities to cut other taxes to save \$100,000, selling off federal land, and getting gatekeepers out of the way to speed up homebuilding.
- 4. Locks up criminals to make you safe.
- Puts Canada First-For a Change.

1 AXE THE TAX TO BOOST THE ECONOMY AND MAKE LIFE AFFORDABLE -**FOR A CHANGE**

After the Lost Liberal Decade, Canadians are out of money—and the government is out of touch.

Groceries, gas, rent, and mortgages are all up. Behind it all? Taxes and red tape. The Liberals have taxed everything—your work, your food, your fuel, your home—then taxed it again, while blocking major projects that would create jobs and lower prices.

It now costs more to grow and ship our food. Farmers pay more, truck drivers pay more, so you pay more. Meanwhile, Liberal gatekeepers enabled corporate tax loopholes for private jets and offshore tax havens, while raising taxes on everyday Canadians.

A Canada First Conservative government will axe the entire carbon tax—on everything, for everyone, for good. And we'll go further, with a Bring It Home Tax Cut on work, homes, investment and energy, so Canadians can keep more, save more, and invest more right here at home.

We'll cut income taxes so workers can keep \$900 more and dual income families can save \$1,800. We'll axe the federal sales tax on new homes and reward cities that cut development charges, saving homebuyers up to \$100,000, to help put home ownership back within reach. After a decade of Liberal waste, it's time you kept more of what you earn, so you can save and build—for yourself, for your family and for your future.



We will:

- Cut the lowest personal income tax rate by 15% from 15% to 12.75%, meaning the average Canadian worker earning \$57,000 will save \$900, with dual-income families saving \$1,800 a year.
- Axe the sales tax on all new homes under \$1.3 million and incentivize municipalities to slash development charges - for a total savings of \$100,000 on an average home in Canada's big cities and \$4,500 per year in mortgage payments.
- **Axe the carbon tax in full.** Repeal the entire carbon tax law, including the federal industrial carbon tax backstop, to restore our industrial base and take back control of our economy from the Americans.
- Scrap the capital gains tax hike and axe the tax on reinvestment in Canada. Any person or business selling an asset will pay no capital gains tax when they reinvest the proceeds in Canada until the end of 2026.
- Offer a Canada First TFSA Top Up that rewards patriotic Canadians who invest in our country-increasing the TFSA limit by an extra \$5,000 for investments in Canadian companies.

- Raise the tax-free income threshold for working seniors up to \$34,000. Allow working seniors to earn up to \$34,000 tax free, \$10,000 more than the current limit.
- Axe the Underused Housing Tax that costs more to administer than is collected in taxes.
- Axe the escalator tax on alcohol and reset the excise duty rates to those in effect before the
 escalator was passed.
- Make the caregiver tax credit refundable.
- Streamline and simplify the Disability Tax Credit, including renaming the certificate and making eligibility automatic for related programs.
- Axe the planned food packaging tax on fresh produce that could drive up grocery costs by up to 30%.
- Scrap the Liberal plastics ban, including the ban on straws, grocery bags, food containers, cutlery, and other single-use plastics, letting consumers and businesses choose what works for them.
- End new labelling requirements for natural health products that will raise costs.
- Never hike taxes and pass the Taxpayer Protection Act to ban new or higher federal taxes without asking taxpayers first in a referendum.

Bring It Home Tax Reform

After a decade of increasing complexity and loopholes that benefit the wealthy and well-connected, it's time to bring fairness and simplicity back to our tax system. We'll put people who actually build things in charge of designing a tax code that works for the Canadians who actually do the work. Within 60 days of forming government, we will launch a **Tax Reform Task Force** made up of farmers, builders, entrepreneurs, economists and workers—not Ottawa insiders. Their job will be to deliver a simple, fair tax code that:

- Rewards work and saving.
- Closes loopholes for the wealthy and well-connected.
- · Eliminates unnecessary red tape.
- Makes it easier for Canadians to file and understand their taxes.

Fiscal Common Sense

Tax relief is only one side of the coin; spending discipline is the other. We'll ensure every dollar spent gets results and stops the runaway growth of government that leaves everyday Canadians behind. We will:

- Pass a one-for-one spending law. For every new dollar spent, an equal amount must be reduced.
- Cut red tape by 25% and bring in a two-for-one rule. We will reduce regulations by 25% within two years, and ensure going forward that two regulations are eliminated for every new one. We will also ensure that for every \$1 of new administrative burden, \$2 is removed. The Auditor General will be required to verify that we deliver on these commitments.

Boost the Economy

Canadians have always been builders. But after the Lost Liberal Decade, our economy has been strangled by red tape, blocked projects, and rising taxes that drove away opportunity and investment.

The Liberals killed pipelines, blocked LNG terminals, imposed a new production cap on Canadian energy, and sent almost half a trillion dollars in investment southward out of Canada. They made us reliant on products from foreign dictators, and made us more dependent on the United States to sell our resources.

A new Conservative government will bring jobs and prosperity back by repealing anti-development laws, clearing the way for Canadian energy and industry, and unleashing the full productive power of our workers and our great land.

Unleash Canadian Energy and Resources

We will get big projects built again by repealing the Liberal anti-development laws and regulations that have cost us half a trillion dollars in lost investment over the last decade. We'll also work with Indigenous partners to process and sell our clean natural resources to get foreign countries off burning higher-emission fuels and fight climate change.

We will:

- Create a National Energy Corridor to rapidly approve and build critical infrastructure and
 end our energy dependence on America so we can stand up to Trump from a position of
 strength. This will fast-track approvals for transmission lines, railways, pipelines, and other
 critical infrastructure across Canada in a pre-approved corridor entirely within Canada,
 transporting our resources across our country and to the world while bypassing the United
 States.
- Bring in "One and Done" approvals and accelerate priority resource projects. Create a single Rapid Resource Project Office to streamline all regulatory approvals into one application and environmental review, in cooperation with provinces, with a target of sixmonth decisions and a one-year maximum timeline to reduce delays and duplication.
- Scrap the consumer and industrial carbon tax. Repeal the entire carbon tax to lower costs
 for working Canadians, boost our economy, and allow our companies to become competitive
 again with the United States.
- Repeal the 'No More Development' Law (C-69), which makes it impossible to build the mines, pipelines, and other major energy infrastructure Canada needs.
- Repeal the West Coast tanker ban (C-48) so we can build new LNG terminals to export our energy overseas, ending our economic dependence on the United States.
- Scrap the Liberal fuel regulations to lower fuel costs and boost our economy.
- Scrap the Liberal electricity tax that infringes on provincial jurisdiction, stifles economic growth, and makes us less competitive with the United States.
- Be champions of Canada's auto sector by maintaining all existing government supports and
 the clean incentives for the auto-sector supply chain, and scrapping the planned \$20,000 tax
 on gas-powered cars to preserve choice for consumers without punitive taxes. We will also
 cut GST on Canadian-made vehicles so long as American tariffs remain in place, and bring in
 a Keep Canadians Working Fund to protect the jobs of workers directly affected by Trump's
 tariffs.
- Scrap the job-killing emissions cap on oil and gas production, which the PBO reports will kill 54,400 full-time jobs and cost Canada \$21 billion in GDP.
- Double oil production in Newfoundland and Labrador, and greenlight the LNG Newfoundland and Labrador project to generate another billion dollars in revenue for Newfoundland's economy, and create thousands of new jobs.
- · Fast-track B.C.'s LNG Canada Phase 2 and the GNL Québec LNG project.
- Build the road to Ontario's Ring of Fire and approve federal permits to harvest chromite, cobalt, nickel, copper, and platinum boosting our economy by billions of dollars, allowing us to become less dependent on the Americans, while our allies overseas would no longer have to rely on hostile regimes for these metals, turning dollars for dictators into paycheques for our people.

- Unlock Arctic ports, approve oil exports from Canada's Arctic ports, and expand the Port of Churchill to extend the shipping season.
- Introduce an optional First Nations Resource Charge to advance economic reconciliation by allowing companies to cede some federal tax room so First Nations communities will no longer need to send all their revenues to Ottawa and then ask for it back, enabling them to take back control of their resources and money.
- Create an Indigenous Opportunities Corporation to advance economic reconciliation by allowing Indigenous Peoples to access equity ownership in major resource projects.

Build Critical Infrastructure Faster And Expand Transport Links

Strong supply chains, fast approvals, and better transport links will get Canada working again. We'll speed up infrastructure and get goods and people moving by:

- Creating "Shovel Ready Zones," which are pre-permitted so projects can break ground immediately.
- Fixing our ports by streamlining regulations and permitting, reforming borrowing caps, preauthorizing future development zones, exploring container shipping on the Great Lakes, extending the shipping season at the Port of Churchill, and reviewing the hours of work regulations for smaller ports.
- Adding new rest areas for truck drivers to support supply chains and improve road safety.
- **Ending tolls on the Confederation Bridge** and reviewing support for the Wood Islands Ferry.
- Supporting the replacement of the Coquitlam River Bridge.



Unleash Domestic Industry and Innovation

Canada's innovators and builders face red tape, unfair competition, and a rigged system. We'll level the playing field, reward local production, and open up trade across provinces and with allies abroad. We will:

- Scrap the capital gains tax hike and the tax on reinvestment in Canada. This will be like rocket fuel for our economy, incentivizing investors—from small business owners, to farmers, to homebuilders—to reinvest and build things here in Canada.
- Reform Investment Tax Credits (ITCs) to reward clean Canadian manufacturing and production to help lower emissions and fight climate change.
- Launch an oligopoly review of key federally-regulated sectors to increase competition and lower costs for Canadians.
- **Implement open banking to increase competition** to improve service and lower costs for Canadians while protecting concerns around privacy and security.
- Ensure tax fairness for workers by banning write-offs for luxury private jets. Corporations will be able to write off the equivalent of a commercial flight. Charter flights needed to get workers to remote job sites will not be impacted by this change.
- Bring the premiers together to slash exceptions in the Canadian Free Trade Agreement and boost interprovincial trade within 30 days of taking office.
- **Introduce a Free Trade Bonus** that rewards provinces that lower the trade and labour mobility barriers that cost our economy billions. Every trade barrier removed by provinces will boost GDP, improve labour mobility, and generate more tax revenue. Conservatives will give increased tax revenue back to provinces to spend on schools, hospitals, and whatever else the provinces choose.
- **Tear down trade barriers on Canadian wine, beer and spirits** by ending the ban on interprovincial alcohol shipments so Canadians can buy and sell across provincial borders.



Free the roads for truck drivers by harmonizing trucking regulations and permits across
provinces to eliminate red tape, cut costs, and open up trade in the sector that keeps our
economy moving.

Fight for Canadian Exports and Jobs

The Lost Liberal Decade has left Canadian businesses and workers falling behind in the global economy and vulnerable to President Trump's unjustified tariffs. We'll stand up to unfair trade practices and fight for good jobs, and fair access to markets. We will be champions of Canada's auto sector by maintaining all existing federal supports, including the clean incentives for the auto-sector supply chain as a part of our Technology, Not Taxes policy to reduce emissions and fight climate change. We will also:

- Cut the federal sales tax on Canadian-made vehicles and launch a Keep Canadians
 Working Fund until US tariffs are lifted to protect the jobs of autoworkers directly targeted by
 Trump's trade war.
- Implement a Buy Canada procurement policy so that federally funded infrastructure and defence projects prioritize Canadian companies employing Canadian workers and using Canadian materials.
- End federal rebates for made-in-China EVs to protect Canadian auto workers and our national security.
- Secure a fair deal on softwood lumber as we achieved under the previous Conservative government to protect our forestry workers.
- Pursue a CANZUK free trade and mobility agreement with the UK, Australia, and New Zealand.
- Use Article 6 of the Paris Agreement to dramatically reduce global emissions and fight climate change by exporting cleaner Canadian resources and technologies.

2 BUILD THE HOMES-FOR A CHANGE

Canada is in a housing crisis and it's not because we ran out of space. We ran out of leadership.

After the Lost Liberal Decade, housing costs have doubled, and taxes on builders and buyers have piled up. Bureaucracy blocked construction, cities hiked development charges, and CMHC executives paid themselves bonuses while young Canadians gave up on the dream of homeownership.

A new Conservative government will build 2.3 million homes over the next five years. Unlike the Liberals, we have a credible and realistic plan to get it done. Instead of building more bureaucracy, we'll reward results, not red tape, free up new federal land in cities, and put housing within reach again by helping Canadians save \$100,000 on the cost of the average new home in our big cities.

Axe the Taxes on Homebuyers and Builders

We will:

- Axe the GST on all new homes under \$1.3 million—saving up to \$65,000 on the cost of a new home and \$3,000 per year in mortgage payments.
- Incentivize cities to reduce development charges, with every dollar of relief a municipality offers in development charges reimbursed by 50%, up to a maximum of \$50,000.
- Scrap the Underused Housing Tax that costs more to administer than is collected in taxes.
- Eliminate the Liberals' new tax on home renovations to support homeowners.
- Remove the requirement to report the sale of your home to the CRA.

Build Homes, Not Bureaucracy

Canadians don't need more housing announcements, they need more homes. We will:

- Tie infrastructure funding to results, not promises, by rewarding cities that permit over 15% more homebuilding annually, and reducing funding for those that fall short.
- Hold back federal dollars from cities that raise building fees or block needed development.
- Require cities to publish approval timelines and development charges so Canadians can see how their city is performing compared to others.
- Fast-track home building through "Shovel Ready Zones" so new homes can be built faster.
- Establish a 60-day standard that CMHC executives must meet for approving or rejecting affordable housing financing applications.
- Remove onerous CMHC program eligibility requirements to make it easier for homebuilders to access the benefits of affordable housing funding.
- Returning CMHC operating expenses back to 2015 Levels.
- Identify 15% of federal buildings and lands to sell for housing in liveable new neighbourhoods within 100 days.
- Simplify and harmonize the National Building Code to make it more affordable to build safely, with maximum flexibility for new materials and new building methods.
- Increase housing density around federally funded transit stations as a condition of receiving funding.
- Require plain language in housing regulations to eliminate gatekeeping and delay.
- Return to a "housing first" approach to eliminating homelessness so that individuals experiencing homelessness can have a stable place to live.
- Build 6,000 new homes on Canadian Forces bases and reverse the Liberal rent hike on military families.

Empower First Nations Communities to Prosper

For too long, Ottawa's one-size-fits-all approach has failed First Nations communities. We will empower First Nations to lead their own housing solutions and support inclusive economic reconciliation by unlocking opportunity and development, on their terms. We will:

- Establish a permanent stream of infrastructure funding to First Nations under the First Nations Fiscal Management Act.
- Provide Indigenous-led housing solutions with direct access to funds.

STOP THE CRIME-FOR A CHANGE

Crime is out of control, and Canadians feel it every day. Car thefts, violence, drug deaths and gang crime are up. After the Lost Liberal Decade, dangerous repeat offenders are quickly released, drug chaos is legalized, police are left powerless and communities helpless.

A new Conservative government will pass the biggest crack down on crime in our history to bring back safe streets with tough laws, more enforcement, and real consequences for violent crime.

We will:

- Introduce a "three strikes, you're out" rule. After three serious offences, offenders will face mandatory minimum 10-year prison sentences with no bail, parole, house arrest, or probation. Even after the 10-year sentence, the offender will not be eligible for release without spotless behaviour and drug tests in prison, and measurably improving their lives, such as through education or learning an employable skill.
- Impose life sentences for fentanyl trafficking, illegal gun trafficking, and human trafficking. For too long, radical Liberals have let crime spiral out of control—Canada will no longer be a haven for criminals.
- Jail, not bail. Repeal Liberal catch-and-release Bill C-75 which lets rampant criminals go free within hours of their arrest.
- End tent cities by empowering law enforcement to remove repeat offenders causing a public nuisance so our public spaces can once more be safe for the public and stop the violence for those living in them.
- Stop intimate partner violence with stricter conditions, first-degree murder charges, and aggravating factors for violence against vulnerable women. We will require the strictest bail conditions for anyone accused of intimate partner violence, including GPS ankle bracelet monitoring, with any breach of conditions resulting in immediate imprisonment. And, we will end the practice of downgrading the murder of an intimate partner to manslaughter, simply because the murderer claims it was a so-called "crime of passion."
- Combat human trafficking with consecutive sentences, automatic bail restrictions, and life sentences for the worst cases.
- Ensure consecutive sentences for mass murderers by restoring true life sentences for multiple murderers. The Supreme Court's shocking decision in the Alexandre Bissonnette case resulted in the sentences of some of Canada's most notorious killers being reduced, giving them a chance to walk free early.
- Stop auto theft, extortion, fraud, and arson with new minimum penalties, no house arrest, and a new more serious offence for organized theft. The Liberals let crime run rampant in our streets by passing Bill C-5, which rolled back mandatory prison time and the ban on house arrest for serious offenders.
- Ensure safe hospitals with penalties for weapons in hospitals and assaults on healthcare workers.
- Protect Canadians online with new laws for AI deepfakes of intimate images, modernized laws against online harassment, and stronger child protection online. Unlike the Liberals, we will protect children and vulnerable people online without infringing upon the civil liberties of law-abiding Canadians.
- Protect places of worship and stop antisemitic riots with tougher sentences for religious property mischief and penalties for masked rioters.

- Introduce new racketeering and money-laundering laws to crack down on money laundering by organized crime with tougher sentences and full asset forfeiture, which will be used to fund even more enforcement.
- Stop forced and child labour with strict new minimum penalties for executives or board members of companies that exploit children and abuse workers for profit, and create a private right of action against goods made with forced and child labour that are sold in Canada.

Restore Public Safety

Canadians deserve safe streets and communities. That starts with restoring law and order, and putting dangerous criminals where they belong—off the street and behind bars. We will:

- Repeal Bill C-83. Canada's most dangerous and sadistic criminals like Luka Magnotta and Paul Bernardo should always be held in maximum-security prisons. Instead, the Liberal Bill C-83 instituted changes that move these prisoners to less restrictive environments over time.
- **Provide closure for families** with no parole without a body in murder cases. Convicted murderers should never be given parole when they are withholding information or evidence that grieving families can use to get closure.
- Implement earned release. Abolish automatic parole and replace it with performance-based earned release. End early release without evidence of meaningful rehabilitation to lower the threat to public safety and security.
- Put AEDs in RCMP vehicles in order to save lives. Canada faces a crisis in rural areas, where a lack of defibrillators results in deaths for people who have sudden cardiac arrests that could otherwise be alive today.
- Require recovery-oriented rehabilitation in prisons, ensuring that more serious offenders struggling with addiction participate in evidence-based therapeutic living programs in prison, where such treatment is available.
- Defend women's safety by repealing Commissioner's Directive 100, which allows male offenders to be housed in women's prisons and ensure that women's spaces and services remain protected in federal institutions and policy.

Firearms Policy: Ban Criminals, Not Hunters

While the Liberals go after farmers and hunters, we'll go after real criminals. Our plan protects the rights of lawful gun owners while cracking down on the violent offenders and illegal guns that cause almost all the gun crime in Canada. We will:

- Create Enhanced Weapons Prohibition Orders to subject repeat violent offenders, including domestic violence, to random searches with judicial oversight.
- Clear the licensing backlog so that hunters and sport shooters can enjoy their lawful pastimes sooner.
- Add plain language to the Firearms Act so that law-abiding Canadians and police can more easily understand and enforce the law.
- Protect licensed sport shooters and hunters because law-abiding Canadians are not the problem.

Support for Faith and Minority Communities

Canada must be a country where everyone feels safe to worship, gather, and speak freely. We'll protect religious and cultural communities from rising hate and extremism. We will:

 Create an Anti-Hate Crime Task Force to protect all threatened religious and cultural communities, including Canada's Jewish, Muslim, Christian, Sikh, Hindu, and other religious communities.

- Direct CSIS to implement threat reduction measures, including communicating with Jewish communities about antisemitic threats, along with Chinese, Sikh and other Canadian communities targeted by foreign threats.
- Streamline access to the Security Infrastructure Program for places of worship, community, and cultural centres.

FIX THE BUDGET TO KILL INFLATION-FOR A CHANGE

After a decade of Liberal deficits, Canadians are broke and the government is bloated. The Liberals doubled the national debt, wasted billions on foreign schemes and consultants, and inflated the cost of everything.

A new Conservative government will bring common sense back to the budget. We'll end waste, cap spending, and review all government spending to demand real results for every tax dollar.

We will shrink the Liberal deficits and eliminate waste by:

- Enacting a one-for-one spending law. Any new spending must be offset by reduced or new revenues.
- Defunding foreign aid to dictators, terrorists and global bureaucracies.
- Close offshore tax loopholes, redirect CRA resources to recover funds, create a name and shame website, and expand the Offshore Tax Informant Program.

Trim Bloated Bureaucracy, Not Services

Your tax dollars are precious, but under this bloated Liberal government, inflationary spending keeps going up while services keep getting worse. Let's cut the fat, not the frontline services Canadians rely on. We will:

Streamline the federal public service through natural attrition and retirement with only 2 in 3 departing employees being replaced.

Eliminate university degree requirements for most federal public service roles to hire for skill, not credentials.

Ban "double-dipping" so federal officials can't also profit from government contracts.

Use plain language laws so legislation is clear, enforceable, and accessible.

We will cut spending on consultants to save \$10.5 billion.

Accountability Act 2.0

Canadians deserve a government that plays by the same rules as they do. We'll restore trust in public office by enforcing transparency, banning insider self-dealing, and ending shadow lobbying once and for all. We will:

> **End shadow lobbying** by requiring anyone advising the government directly or indirectly, who stands to gain financially from their advice, to register as a lobbyist.



- Ban politicians from making decisions that benefit themselves or their families disproportionately, and require Ethics Commissioner approval and full public disclosure of all personal interests.
- Increase fines for ethics violations to \$10,000.
- **Enforce tax transparency** by requiring anyone running for public office to disclose where they paid taxes for the last seven years.
- Require cabinet ministers to divest fully from tax havens and disclose assets to the Conflict of Interest Commissioner, with penalties for non-compliance. No more so-called blind trusts that only blind the public.
- Require party leaders to disclose their assets within 30 days of becoming leader and require Prime Ministers to divest their assets within 30 days of assuming office.

STAND UP FOR CANADA-FOR A CHANGE

Canada should never be a doormat for foreign interests. Not for Beijing. Not for Washington. Not for anyone. Yet after the Lost Liberal Decade, Canada is weaker and more dependent, having lost investment, military capability, and global reputation.

A new Conservative government will restore our independence, rebuild our historic strengths, and stand up for Canadians at home and abroad.

Rebuild Canada's Military and Defend the North

A strong country must be able to defend itself. After the Lost Liberal Decade hollowed out the Canadian Armed Forces, Conservatives will rebuild our military capability—starting with our North. We will:

- Streamline procurement by re-establishing the cabinet committee on military procurement and creating a new PCO-secretariat to ensure that military procurement issues are central in the machinery of government. We will also work with Canada's defence industry to increase capacity, and make a single minister responsible to ensure accountability.
- Rapidly expand military expenditures to reach NATO's defence spending target by 2030.
- Fix the CAF's recruiting crisis by increasing our Reserve Force to 30,000 and our Regular Force to 71,500 within 18 months.
- Build CFB Igaluit, Canada's first permanent Arctic military base since the Cold War.
- Double the size of the 1st Patrol Group of the Canadian Rangers from 2,000 to 4,000.
- Acquire two new heavy icebreakers for the Royal Canadian Navy, in addition to the two new icebreakers being delivered to the Coast Guard, for a total of four new icebreakers.
- Build a new Arctic naval base in Churchill, Manitoba. This will serve as a base of operations for Canada's new polar icebreakers and will allow the Port of Churchill to sustain a continuous commercial shipping season.
- Upgrade the Forward Operating Location in Inuvik to full base status (CFB Inuvik) to host fighter jets and Husky tankers.
- Immediately launch an open competition to purchase a fleet of Airborne Warning and Control Systems to increase radar surveillance and command capabilities in Arctic skies.
- Build the Arctic Security Corridor from Yellowknife, N.W.T. to Grays Bay, Nunavut. This will
 include a 600 km all-season road from Yellowknife to Grays Bay and a strategic upgrade to
 the Port of Grays Bay.

- Establish a new Canadian Army reserve unit at Whitehorse and restore Operation NANOOK to its full strength, as it was under the previous Conservative government.
- Expand the cadets and Junior Canadian Rangers programs by adding 10,000 cadet spots and tripling the size of the Junior Canadian Rangers.
- Rapidly build 6,000 new homes on Canadian Forces bases and reverse the Liberal rent hike on military families.
- Speed up planned military upgrades, including Northern Operational Support Hubs, new submarines to replace the Victoria-class fleet, tactical helicopters, and a new satellite ground station in the Arctic.

Secure Our Borders and Keep Canadians Safe

A country that can't control its borders can't protect its people. After the Lost Liberal Decade, illegal border crossings have surged, and enforcement has broken down. A new Conservative government will restore order by securing our borders, enforcing our laws and keeping Canadians safe at home.

We will implement a Border Security Package with:

- More boots on the ground by hiring at least 2,000 more border agents.
- New scanners and surveillance at ports. These scanners can see through walls of containers or vehicles to spot drugs, guns, and stolen cars.
- Departure tracking to monitor overstays so government officials know who is in Canada illegally.
- New drones and surveillance towers. Add a mix of 120 surveillance towers and 90 landbased truck bed-mounted drone systems to secure the border.
- Utilize military assistance as appropriate to secure the border.
- **Expand Canada Border Services Agency's mandate** to patrol anywhere along the border, not just at official crossings.



End Foreign Influence and Economic Dependence

Canada must always work for Canadians first. That means standing up to hostile regimes and foreign tech agendas, and protecting our democracy and economy from outside interference. We will:

- Close Canada Elections Act loopholes to stop third parties from hiding funding sources that can allow for foreign financing of third parties engaging in regulated electoral activities.
- Maintain tariffs on strategic Chinese imports to protect our national security and Canadian workers.
- End tax incentives and rebates for made-in-China EVs.
- Pass a Farmland Protection Act to stop foreign governments and corporations from buying up Canadian farmland, and report on how much farmland is already owned by foreign governments and foreign corporations.

Strengthen National Security

Canada must be ready to face new threats—from foreign interference to cyber attacks to organized crime. But after the Lost Liberal Decade, our national security institutions are underfunded, outdated and overwhelmed. We will rebuild their strength, sharpen their focus, and protect Canadians from threats at home and from abroad. We will:

- Crack down on money laundering and financial crime by creating an Anti-Money Laundering Task Force, dramatically increasing penalties, targeting high-risk regions, seizing criminal assets faster, and treating financial crime as a national security threat.
- Evaluate and improve Canada's national threat assessment procedures.
- Increase CSIS and RCMP focus on national and transnational crimes including espionage, foreign interference, and money laundering.

Stand Up to Hostile Regimes

Canada must be a voice for freedom, justice, and human rights in the world. We'll call out brutal regimes and support the people who resist them. We will:

- Strengthen alliances and ties with countries that share our values to stand up against hostile and authoritarian regimes that threaten global security and stability.
- Continue to strongly support Ukraine's war to defend itself against Putin's illegal invasion, including by sending Ukraine \$22 billion in frozen Russian assets, and by always recognizing the sovereignty and integrity of Ukraine's territory.
- Stand up against the tyrannical regime in Tehran and ensure justice for the Canadian citizens murdered in the downing of Flight PS752, including seizing the assets of the Iranian regime in Canada and giving them to the families of the victims. We will also expel any agents of the Iranian Revolutionary Guard (IRGC) and support the political freedoms of the Iranian people including those involved in the Woman, Life, Freedom movement.
- Defund international institutions like UNRWA and the Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank that don't uphold Canada's interests and values.
- Expel agents of foreign governments engaged in intimidation and coercion in Canada.
- Recognize the legitimate winner of Venezuela's election. A Conservative government will recognize Edmundo González as the winner of the 2024 election in Venezuela and as Venezuela's rightful President.

Restore Order to Immigration

Under the last Conservative government, Canada had an immigration system that worked. It was fair, orderly, and the envy of the world.

But after the Lost Liberal Decade, that system is broken. The Liberals' reckless and unsustainable immigration surge overwhelmed Canadian housing and healthcare services.

We will restore integrity to the system by cracking down on fraud and dramatically reducing the number of temporary foreign workers and foreign students, and limiting permanent immigration to a sustainable rate similar to the levels under the Harper government. We will prioritize those who are most needed, who grow our economy and meet our healthcare needs, and rebuild an immigration system that works for newcomers and Canadians alike.

We will:

- Keep the rate of population growth below the rate of housing growth, job growth, and health care accessibility to ensure sustainable immigration levels that are fair for Canadians and newcomers alike.
- Reject the radical Liberal Century Initiative proposal to grow Toronto to a city of 33.5 million, Montreal to a city of 12.2 million, Vancouver to a city of 11.9 million, Calgary-Edmonton to cities of 15.5 million, and Ottawa-Gatineau to a city of 4.8 million within a single lifetime.
- Require union LMIA pre-checks, ensuring unions get consulted before employers hire temporary foreign workers, to protect Canadian jobs.
- Require criminal background checks for individuals entering Canada on a student permit.
- Process refugee claims faster on a last-in, first-out basis and implement departure tracking so we have a clear idea of how many people are overstaying their visa.
- **Expand and speed up removals for any criminal activity on a visitor permit.** Anyone who is here on a visitor visa who breaks our laws will be removed from Canada.



6 MAKE LIFE BETTER FOR ALL CANADIANS-FOR A CHANGE

After the Lost Liberal Decade, Canadians are working harder, paying more, and getting less. Ottawa's top-down bureaucracy has failed to deliver for everyday people—whether it's protecting our lands and waters, fixing our broken healthcare system, or respecting our seniors, workers, and Indigenous communities.

Protect the Environment and Lower Emissions

Canada has the world's cleanest energy, strongest environmental regulations, and most responsible resource industries. But during the Lost Liberal Decade, environmental action was replaced with costly ideology and symbolism, taxing working families without significantly reducing actual environmental waste and pollution.

A new Conservative government will restore common sense to environmental protection. We'll protect Canada's land, water, wildlife, and air—with conservation and pride in our parks, wilderness, and outdoor heritage. We'll pursue environmental protection that works by:

- Ending the dumping of raw sewage into Canada's waterways.
- Adapting Marine Protected Areas to ensure science, not ideology, determines where harvesters can land their catch.
- Reform Investment Tax Credits (ITCs) to reward clean Canadian manufacturing and production to help lower emissions and fight climate change.
- Use Article 6 of the Paris Agreement to bring home jobs while exporting cleaner resources like Canadian liquified natural gas (LNG) and technologies to help lower global emissions.

Outdoor Heritage and Recreation

Create an Outdoor Heritage Fund to support hunting, fishing, and conservation efforts.

Fix Fisheries Management

We will support Canadian harvesters and coastal communities with a real fisheries strategy by:

- Implementing a Made-in-B.C. Owner/Operator Policy to prohibit foreign and corporate ownership of new BC commercial fishing access, grandfathering current cases pending ownership transparency.
- **Creating a public registry** of quota and license holders.
- Ensuring that fishing is allowed only in accordance with DFO regulations.
- **Implementing "marked selective salmon" fisheries** for hatchery salmon to protect vulnerable species.
- Investing in fisheries science and Integrated Fisheries Management Plans.
- Balancing ecosystems by managing pinniped predation.
- Maintaining the willing buyer-willing seller model for quota transfers.
- Doubling permanent funding for small craft harbours.

Fix Healthcare and Support Caregivers

Canada's healthcare system is broken—not because we don't spend enough, but because government gatekeepers block access to care. Patients wait, doctors burn out, and Canadians suffer while the Liberals make excuses.

A new Conservative government will fix the system by removing barriers, recognizing credentials, respecting workers, and empowering families.

We will protect our healthcare system and the Canada Health Act with its central promise that every Canadian should have timely access to healthcare without charge. We will honour current federal health transfer agreements to fund the healthcare all Canadians deserve, preserve existing dental care coverage and honour existing deals with provinces and territories on child care and pharmacare.

Blue Seal National Credentialing Plan

Qualified Canadians and newcomers are too often blocked from working because of red tape. We'll remove those barriers so skilled people can help fix our broken system. We will launch a Blue Seal Program to help Canadians and newcomers get to work faster by:

- Working with provinces to create nationally-recognized licenses for doctors, nurses, early childhood educators, and other professions.
- Providing small loans to help new Canadians complete Blue Seal certification.
- Bringing home Canadian students studying medicine abroad by expanding residency spots for them here, where they want to work in our healthcare system.
- Rapidly recognizing U.S.-board certified professionals to bring more qualified physicians to meet Canadians' health care needs.
- Adding 15,000 doctors by 2030.

We will protect healthcare access and values by:

- Upholding the Canada Health Act and defending universal public health care.
- Maintaining the party's 21-year-old policy that a "Conservative Government will not support any legislation to regulate abortion." There will be no laws, rules or regulations passed restricting abortion.

Drug Reform and Innovation

Families across Canada are being torn apart by addiction. Our plan focuses on accountability, recovery, and real support to help those afflicted get their lives back. We will:

- Bring Our Loved Ones Home Drug-Free by helping 50,000 Canadians recover from addiction.
- Ban drug dens within 500 metres of schools, parks, and seniors homes and impose strict new oversight rules to ensure they are pathways for treatment and recovery.
- End the failed Liberal so-called "safe supply" experiment that has flooded streets with taxpayer-funded addictive opioids, keeping people hooked instead of helping them heal.
- Distribute 300,000 nasal naloxone kits to save lives and stop overdoses.
- Create a national outcomes dashboard to ensure transparency of data and allow provinces to track best practices.
- Compassionate Intervention. Allow judges to sentence offenders to mandatory treatment for addiction to help people struggling with severe addictions.
- Safely speed up Drug Approval for drugs approved by 2 of 3 peer jurisdictions, ensure companies share all data on pediatric drug use, and implement a rare diseases strategy to support treatment development.
- Launch a \$44 billion lawsuit against Big Pharma to pay for addiction treatment and recovery.

Support Family Caregivers and Canadians with Special Needs

Every family deserves support. We will provide real help for caregivers and Canadians with disabilities so no one is left behind by:

- Making the caregiver tax credit refundable.
- Renaming and streamlining the Disability Tax Credit to "Certification of Disability" and make access automatic for related benefits.
- Funding 1,000 Autism Support Worker training spots annually to better support students, families, and schools.
- **Doubling the reach of the** *Ready, Willing and Able* **program**, helping 4,000 Canadians with autism or intellectual disabilities find and keep jobs.

Respect Workers, Veterans and Seniors

Canada was built by people who work with their hands and serve with their hearts. Under the Liberals, both have been disrespected—by policy, by red tape, and by an out-of-touch Ottawa elite far removed from the people who work and serve.

A new Conservative government will honour those who served, and empower those who build.

Support Labour and Trades

We will restore respect and opportunity for workers with a comprehensive action plan by:

- Boosting funding to the Union Training and Innovation Program (UTIP) and expanding it to cover capital investments like training halls.
- Pass the Tax Fairness for Travelling Trades Workers Act to allow full tax deductibility for travel.
- Working with the provinces to harmonize health and safety rules across jurisdictions to protect workers everywhere.
- Reinstating apprenticeship grants and streamlining El for apprentices.
- Creating a Trades Toolkit for high schools.
- Requiring banks to recognize apprenticeship credentials for RESP eligibility.
- Reviewing the hours of work regulations for small and medium sized ports by consulting with labour representatives to ensure greater flexibility.
- Respecting union rights—no return to anti-union bills like C-377 or C-525, and no right-towork laws.

Honour and Support our Veterans

Canada's veterans must never be left behind. We'll provide the support, training, and recognition our heroes deserve. We will:

- Ease the transition to civilian life with job training, placement support, and mentorship.
- Help veterans manage injuries and disabilities, with streamlined support and easier access to benefits.
- Honour our veterans with ceremonies, recognition, made-in-Canada documentaries to tell the story of Canadians' contributions to winning the World Wars, and new national monuments for those who served in Afghanistan and the Second World War.
- Advance the case for Jess Larochelle to be the first recipient of the Canadian Victoria Cross.

Expand Helmets to Hardhats to connect veterans with skilled trades and construction careers.

Help Seniors

Our seniors worked to build this country. We will honour their contributions by protecting their income, their independence and their security in retirement by:

- Maintaining the age of retirement at 65 for GIS, OAS, and CPP.
- Allow seniors the option of keeping their RRSPs another 2 years before mandatory conversion to RRIFs (from 71 to 73).
- **Protecting working seniors' income** by letting them earn up to \$34,000 tax-free.
- Stopping scams targeting seniors by passing the Stop Scamming Seniors Act to force banks and telecoms to block fraud in real-time, delay suspicious transactions, and impose minimum jail time for fraudsters.





Stand With Indigenous Peoples

For too long, Ottawa's approach to Indigenous issues has been top-down, bureaucratic, paternalistic, and slow. Programs serve consultants instead of communities. Economic prosperity for Indigenous Peoples takes a back seat.

A new Conservative government will work with Indigenous partners in a Nation-to-Nation relationship focusing on real outcomes, opportunity, and ownership. We will continue the Permanent Bilateral Mechanisms with First Nations, Inuit, and Metis.

Indigenous Prosperity and Ownership

We will:

- Create a First Nations Resource Charge (FNRC), a refundable tax credit for 50% of payments made by businesses to First Nations for resource wealth and commercial housing.
- Support the creation of a Canadian Indigenous Opportunities Corporation, led by Indigenous Peoples, to provide shared equity in resource and industrial projects.
- Ensure infrastructure dollars flow directly to communities, not consultants, with a permanent funding stream through the First Nations Fiscal Management Act.
- Launch an Indigenous Outcomes Fund to support measurable, community-led solutions.

We will also respect Indigenous governance and consultation by:

- Establishing a Nation-to-Nation consultation process for major legislation and projects directly impacting First Nations, Inuit and Metis.
- Supporting Indigenous languages and culture through community-led media and education.

We will also support housing and infrastructure for Indigenous communities by:

- Simplifying and unlocking federal funding programs for Indigenous housing and community development.
- Supporting Indigenous-designed housing programs that meet local needs and respect traditional cultural materials and design.
- Including Indigenous communities in national housing targets and infrastructure planning.

PROTECT OUR SHARED CANADIAN IDENTITY - FOR A CHANGE

Wilfrid Laurier once said, "Canada is free, and freedom is its nationality." But during the Lost Liberal Decade, freedom of speech has been threatened, history erased, and voices silenced by censorship laws and corporate collusion.

A new Conservative government will restore free speech, protect personal liberties, honour our shared story, and promote Canadian culture and history.

We will support media freedom by:

- Introducing a Freedom of Speech Act to repeal Liberal censorship laws and restore Canadian news on Meta and other platforms.
- Boosting the Local Journalism Initiative by \$25 million for local news.
- Ensuring all domestic government advertising dollars are spent on Canadian platforms only.
- Providing \$25 million in support for Indigenous language media.
- Supporting remote-area internet connectivity so every Canadian has reliable access to news.
- We will save by defunding the CBC and reforming Crown corporations while maintaining Radio-Canada services. English-language CBC should be a Canadian-owned, self-sufficient media organization that is a not-for-profit and supported by listeners, donations, sponsorships, ad revenue, and licensing revenue.

We will also **celebrate Canada's story** by:

- Restoring in-person citizenship ceremonies and updating the citizenship oath to add the following words: "I pledge gratitude to those who worked, sacrificed, and gave their lives to defend the freedom I now enjoy and to build the country of Canada I now call home. Like them, I pledge to fulfil my duties as a Canadian citizen."
- **Doubling the number of language exchange spots** so that every year, 10,000 youth who would not otherwise be able to afford it will have the opportunity to bridge the two solitudes and strengthen our two official languages.
- Erecting national monuments to honour Canadian Armed Forces veterans who served in the Second World War and those who served in Afghanistan.
- Funding the first made-in-Canada documentaries about Canadians' contributions to winning the World Wars so future Canadians do not forget the courage and sacrifice of those generations and their stories live on.
- Restoring Canadian monuments and heroes like Terry Fox and Vimy Ridge, as well as our Indigenous Peoples, to our Canadian passport.

Protect Free Speech on Campus

Free speech is a cornerstone of Canadian democracy. We will ensure campuses remain places of debate, not censorship by:

 Requiring universities to enforce the standards of section 2 of the Charter's freedom of expression as a condition for federal funding.

Protect Personal Autonomy, Privacy, and Data Security

- Ban the dismissal of federal workers based solely on COVID vaccine status.
- Oppose any move toward mandatory digital ID systems.
- Prohibit the Bank of Canada from developing or implementing a central bank digital currency.
- Remove the CRA's home sale reporting requirement.

Quebec Platform

Quebec is not just a province. As the previous Conservative government recognized, it's a nation within a united Canada. A Conservative government will respect Quebec's autonomy and protect its language and culture.

Responsible federalism: A Conservative government is committed to responsible federalism that respects the Quebec nation and its autonomy. Under a Conservative government, federalism will be guided by the principles of responsibility and cooperation, making Quebec and the provinces true partners, not subordinates of the federal government. With responsible federalism, the federal government will be smaller, Quebec will be more autonomous, and Quebecers will be freer and more prosperous.

Autonomy of Quebec and the provinces: A Conservative government is committed to respecting the autonomy of Quebec and the provinces. No federal initiative or policy that falls under the exclusive jurisdiction of the provinces will be implemented without prior agreement with Quebec or the other provinces.

Immigration: A Conservative government will respect the spirit of the Canada-Quebec Accord by giving Quebec the power to select temporary immigrants under the International Mobility Program, with the exception of asylum seekers and workers subject to international agreements. It will work with Quebec to halve the number of non-permanent residents on its territory. Conscious of the challenges associated with the labour shortage in several regions of Quebec, a Conservative government is committed to working with Quebec and small and medium-sized businesses to meet their needs.

Century Initiative: A Conservative government will oppose the radical plans of the Century Initiative, an activist group that wants to increase Canada's population to 100 million by 2100.

French language: A Conservative government recognizes that the French language is in decline and must be protected. It is committed to working with the Government of Quebec and Canada's Francophonie to protect and promote the French language. The Conservative Party recognizes the unique role of the Government of Quebec in ensuring the survival of the French language and Quebec culture.

Culture: A Conservative government is committed to maintaining all funding in support of Quebec and Francophone culture.

Radio-Canada: A Conservative government is committed to preserving francophone Radio-Canada services across the country.

Governor General: In the future, a Conservative government commits to appointing a bilingual Governor General, perfectly at ease in both of Canada's official languages.

Anti-Woke ideology: A Conservative government will put an end to the imposition of the Woke ideology in the federal public service and in the allocation of federal funds for university research.

Quebec City tramway: A Conservative government will not fund the construction of the Quebec City tramway, a costly and unpopular project.

Third link: A Conservative government is committed to helping fund a third link, a project that is essential for the mobility, safety and economic development of the greater Quebec City region.

Natural resources and LNG Québec: A Conservative government will create Shovel-Ready Zones across the country to accelerate the development of natural resources, paving the way for the relaunch of LNG Québec, a project essential to the economic prosperity of the Saguenay-Lac-Saint-Jean region.

Caribou decree: A Conservative government is committed to cancelling the federal decree on caribou, which threatens the economy of several Quebec regions. It is up to the Quebec government, not the federal government, to find a balance between protecting the caribou and logging.

Softwood lumber: A Conservative government is committed to renegotiating a softwood lumber agreement with the United States to boost exports and support the forestry industry, a key sector for the economy of Quebec's regions.

Health transfers: A Conservative government is committed to honouring all health transfer agreements so that the provinces can count on stable and predictable long-term funding. Plus increases already budgeted by the federal government.



FISCAL TRACK

In addition to costing provided by the Parliamentary Budget Office, this platform was developed with input from two of Canada's most respected economic experts as verifiers and validators: Philip Cross, former Chief Economic Analyst at Statistics Canada, and Dr. Tim Sargent, former Associate Deputy Minister at Finance Canada.

They reviewed and assessed the calculations and assumptions underlying individual measures and the overall fiscal framework, including revenue projections tied to economic growth from eliminating the electric vehicle mandate, the emissions cap, the clean fuel standard, and implementing the proposed capital gains deferral holiday.

Cross and Sargent each independently reviewed these estimates and confirm they are reasonable and consistent with research conducted in these areas.
